Medicaid Health Insurance Programs

STAR

Most people who have Medicaid in Texas get their coverage through the STAR managed care program. STAR covers low-income children, pregnant women and families. STAR members get their services through health plans they choose in their particular service area. Cook Children's Health Care System is in the Tarrant Service Area.

STAR Kids

STAR Kids is a Texas Medicaid managed care program that provides Medicaid benefits to children and adults, ages 20 and younger who have disabilities.

Participation in the STAR Kids program is required for those who are 20 or younger, covered by Medicaid, and meet at least one of the following:

- * Receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
- * Receive Medicaid and Medicare
- * Live in a community-based intermediate care facility for individuals with an intellectual disability or related condition (ICF/IID) or nursing facility
- * Get services through the Medically Dependent Children Program (MDCP) waiver
- * Get services through the Youth Empowerment Services (YES) waiver
- * Get services through any of the intellectual and developmental disability (IDD) waiver programs

Non-Medicaid Health Insurance Program

CHIP

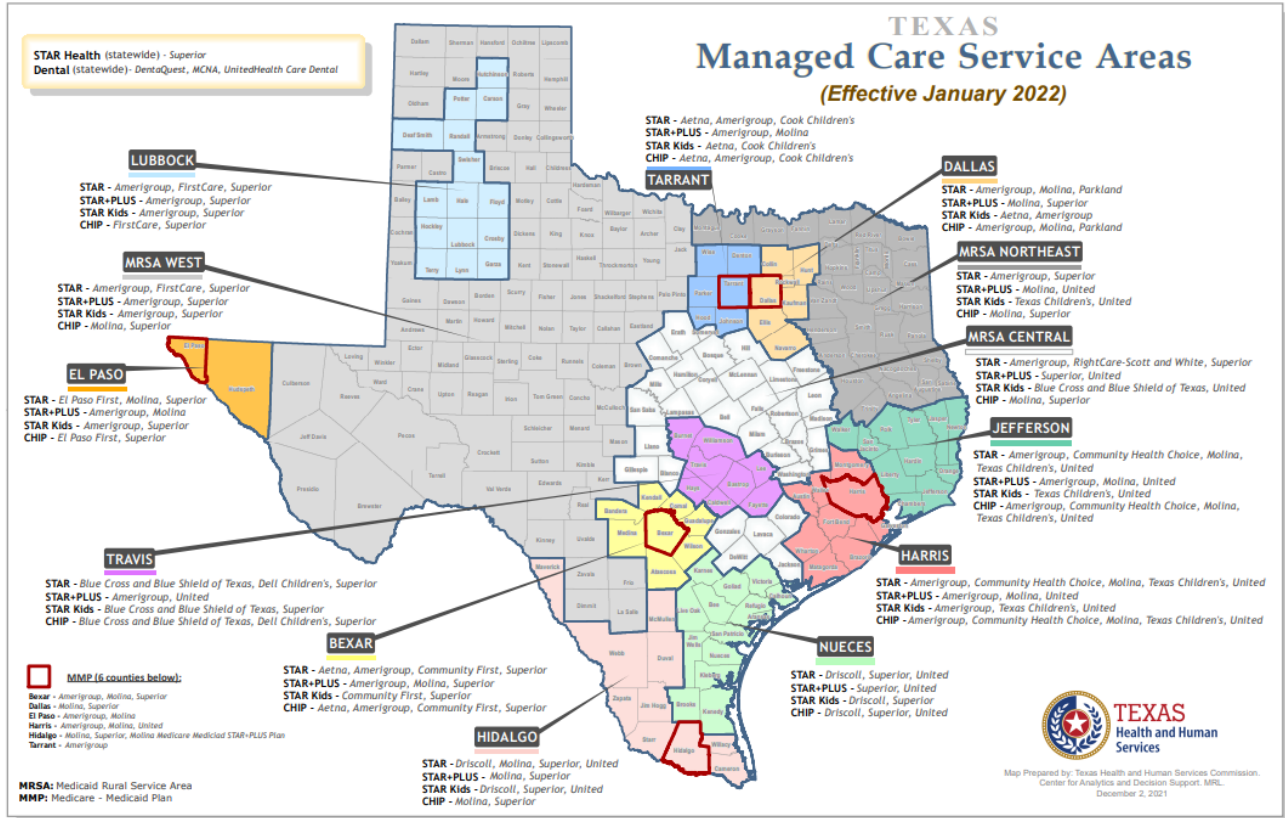
Children's Health Insurance Plan (CHIP) covers children in families that earn too much money to qualify for Medicaid but cannot afford to buy private insurance. Copayments are required, typically ranging from \$3-\$35, and amount is based on financial qualifications.

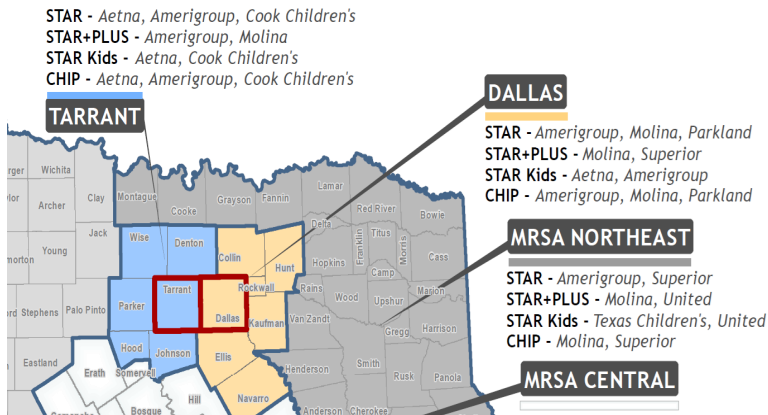

2022 income guidelines for CHIP/Children's Medicaid

- 1 Find your family size on the left.
- 2 Is your family's income less than the monthly income shown in the green Medicaid section? *If so, your child might qualify for Medicaid.
- 3 If your income is higher, follow the row to the orange CHIP section. Your children might get CHIP if your income is less than the monthly income shown in the orange section. Children of families with higher income also may qualify in some cases.

Medicaid Medical Transportation

Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) Services provided by **Access2Care**

NEMT services provide transportation to non-emergency health care appointments for Members who have no other transportation options. These trips include rides to the doctor, dentist, hospital, pharmacy, and other places you get Medicaid services. These trips do NOT include ambulance trips.
