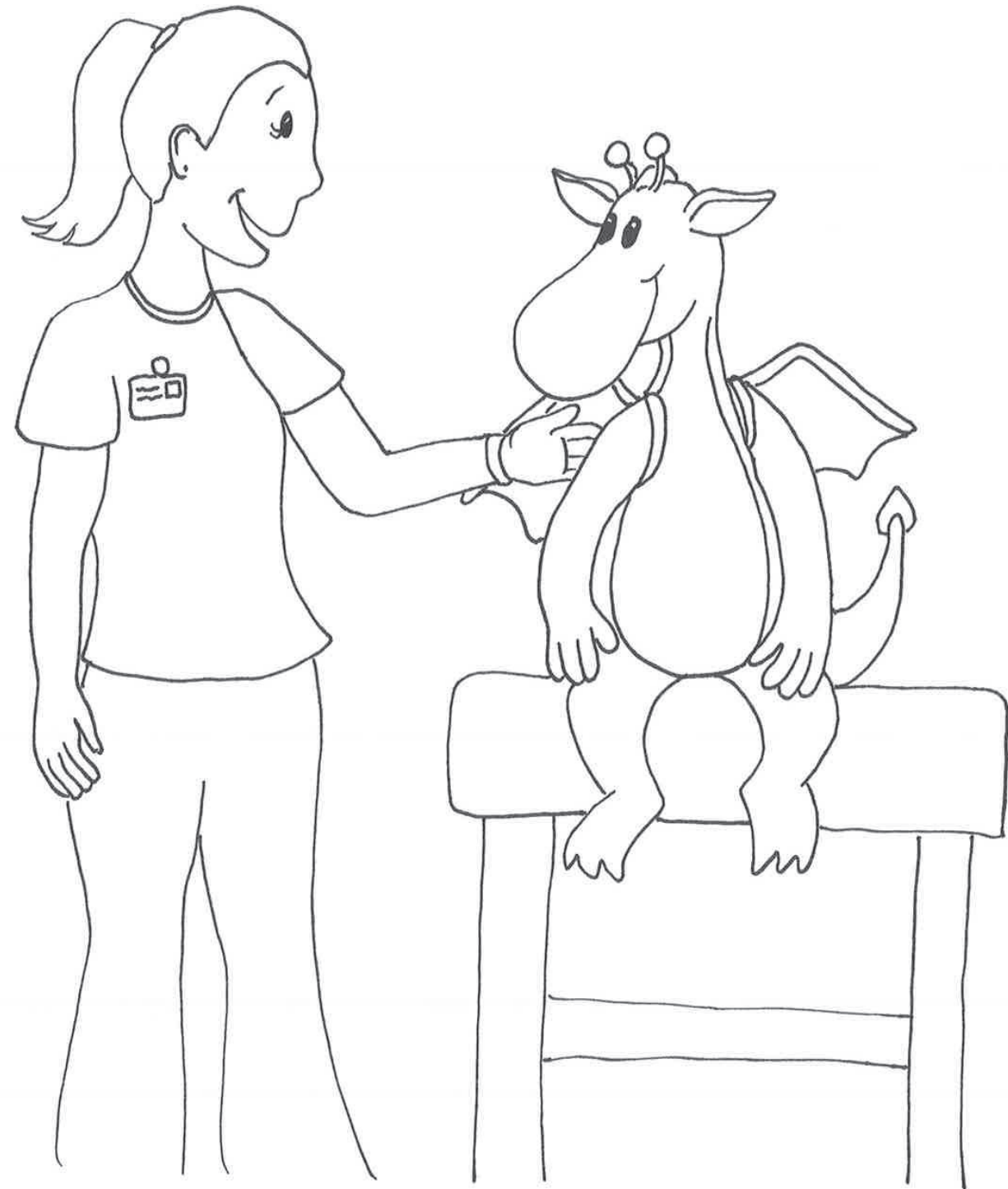

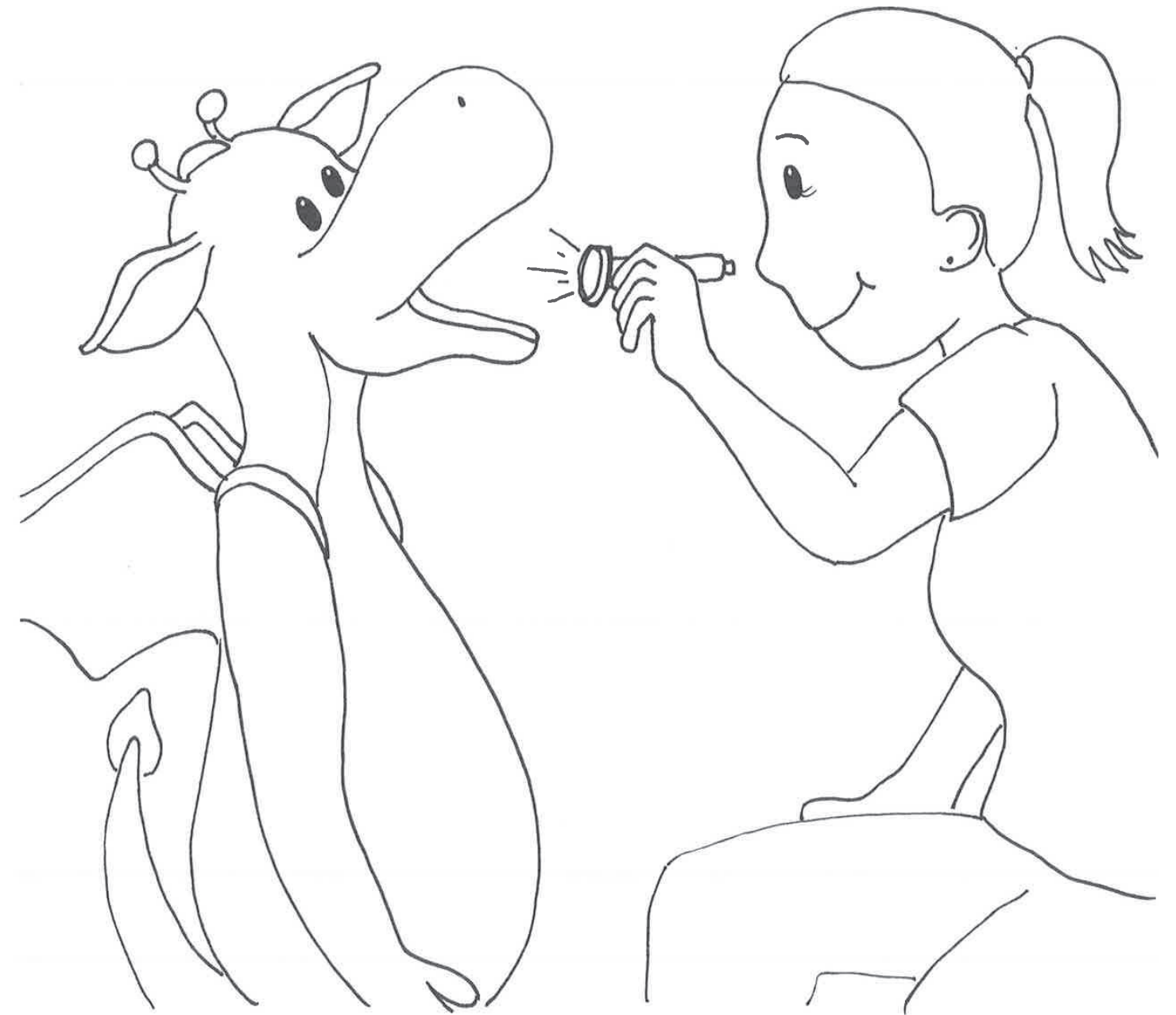

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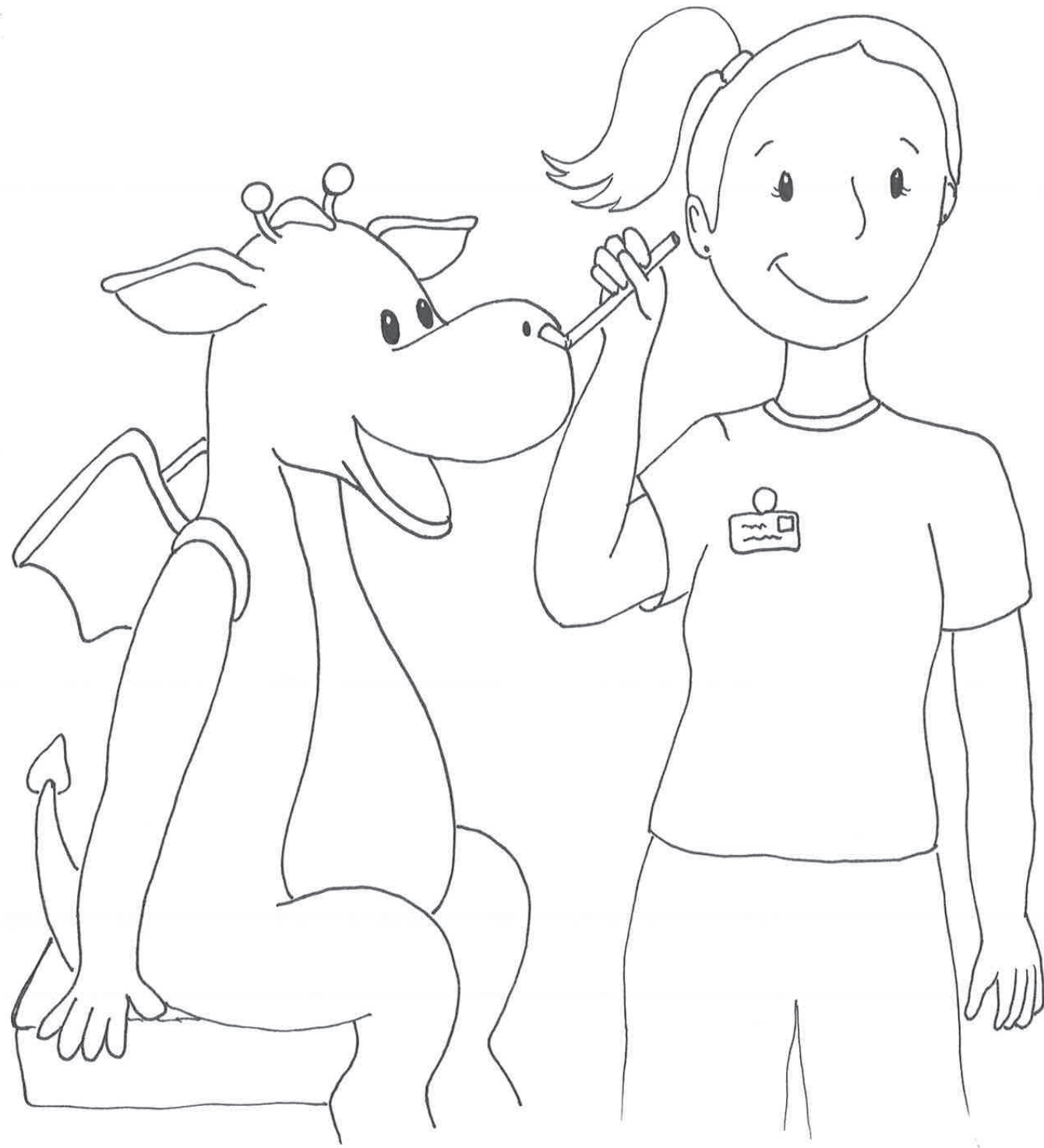


First, Peaks meets the speech pathologist. She is going to ask some questions and talk to him about getting a scope.



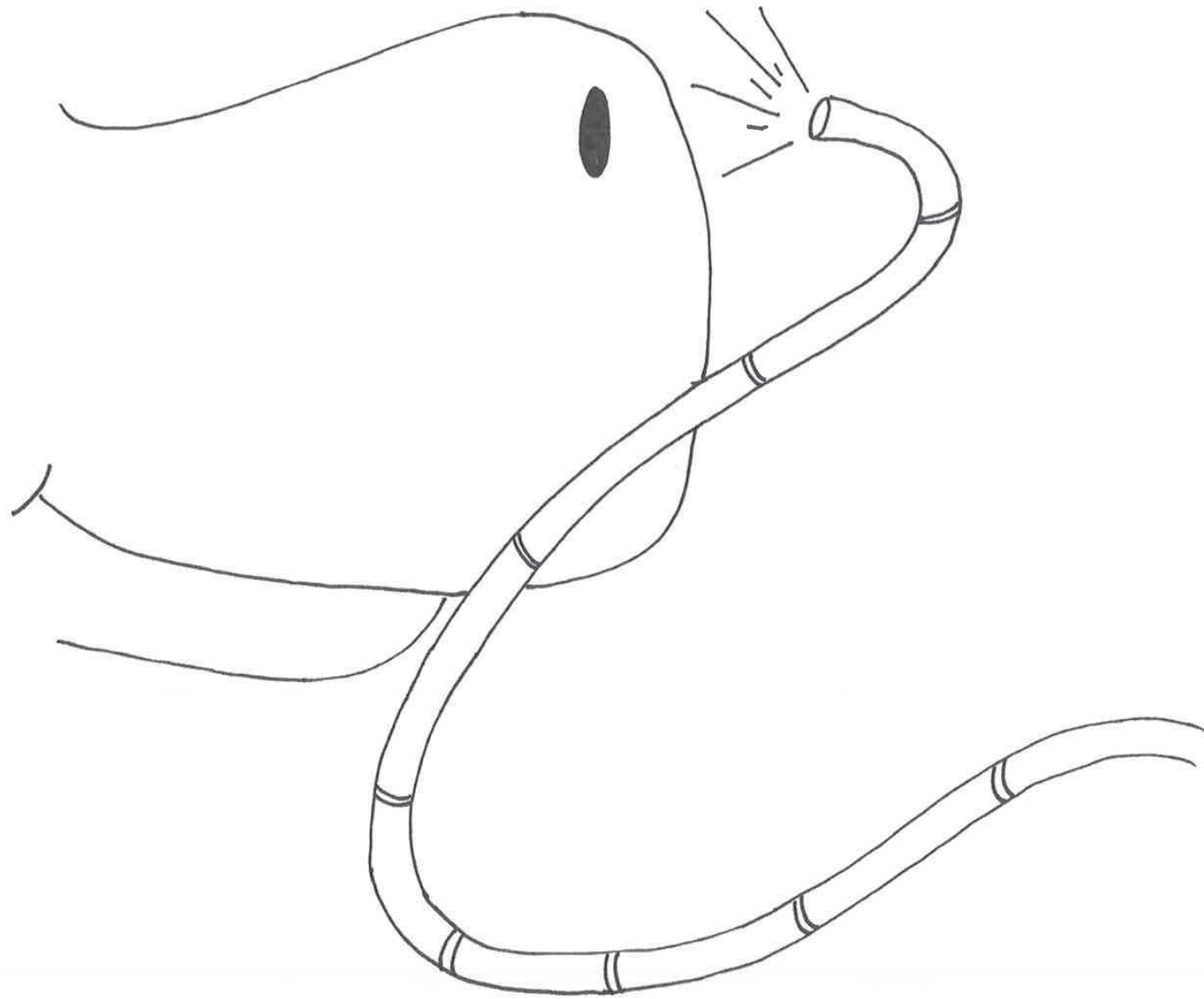
The speech pathologist will look in Peaks' mouth. He will need to open his mouth big, like a hippo and say, "AHH!" The speech pathologist will peek in his mouth with a flashlight. See if you can open wide like Peaks!

Then the speech pathologist will ask Peaks to say some words and silly sentences. She will listen to his nose with a straw while he talks. This helps her to hear if any air is coming out when Peaks talks.

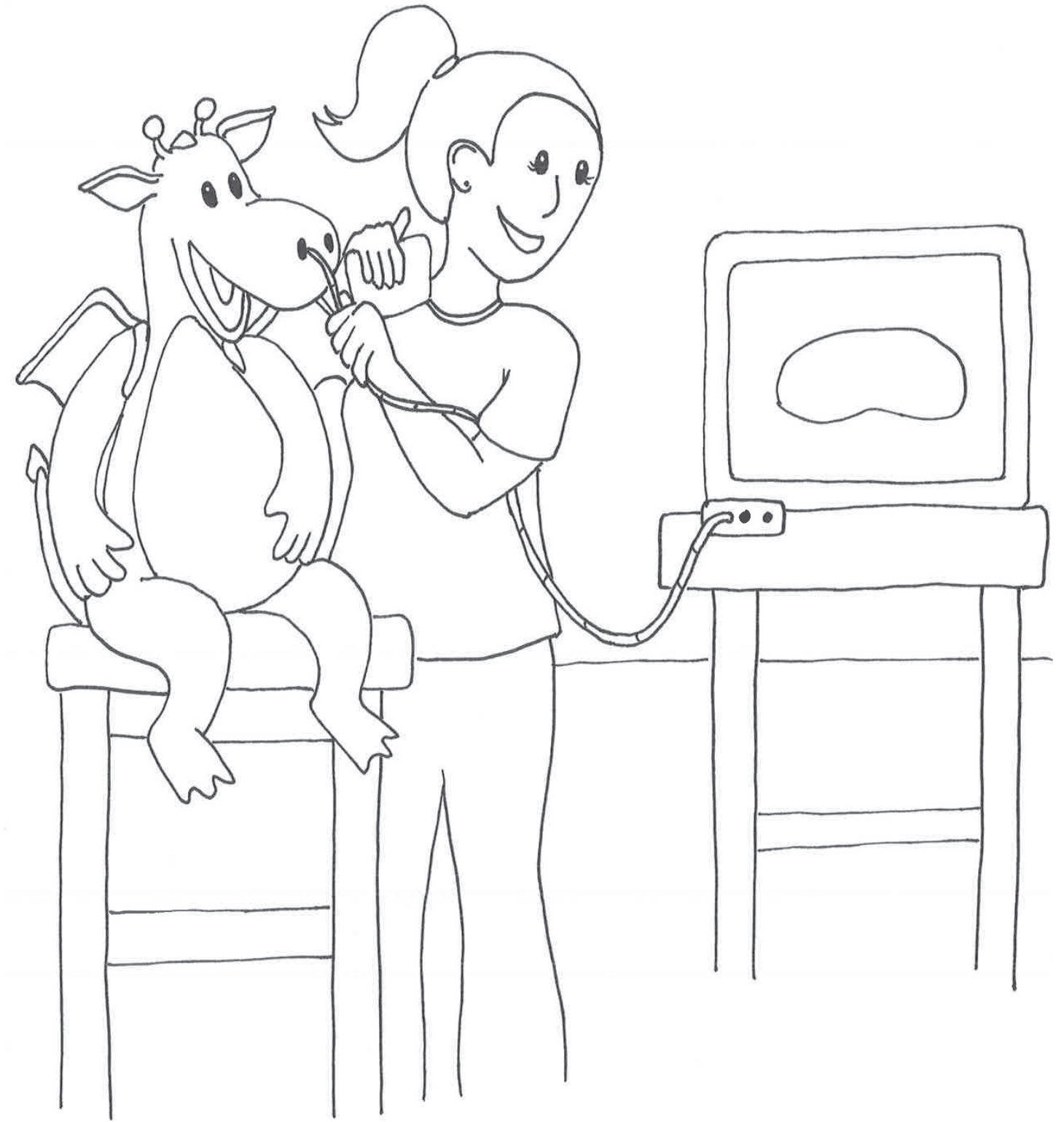

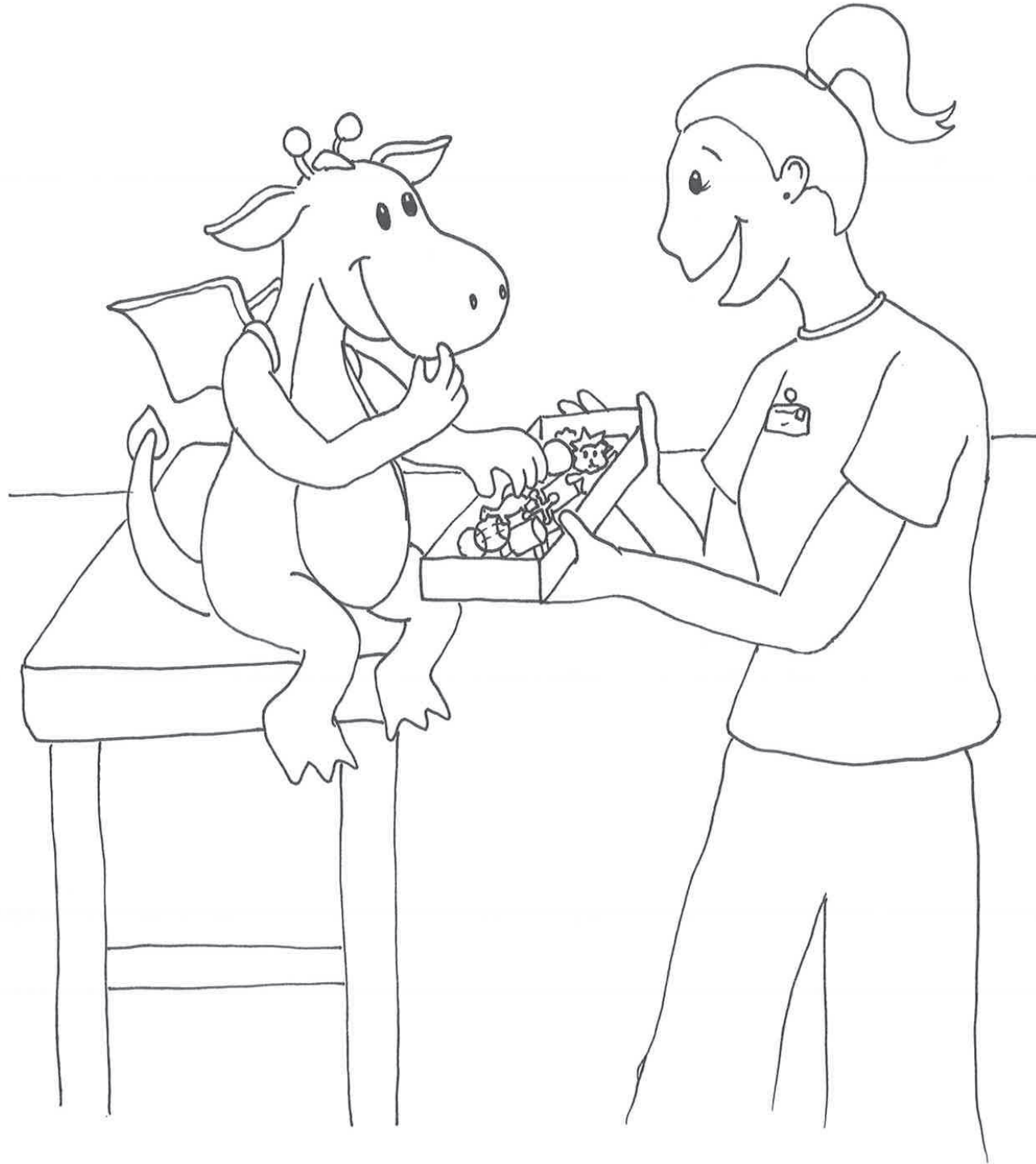
